JILL GREENBERG

Do we love Jill Greenberg for her controversial conceptual images? Exuberant editorial portraits? Delightfully anthropomorphized animal photographs? Yes, yes, and yes. This year, we particularly love these portraits of French electronic super-duo Daft Punk. Shot for Vibe, the session was a happy marriage between the personal and professional. "I've always shot lots of musicians, but they're not usually the musicians I actually listen to. I had been listening to [Daft Punk] since 1997, so it was really exciting," Greenberg says. The duo came with a built-in technical challenge: "I was very, very concerned with their chrome helmets," she says. "I chose to use hot lights. All the starbursts are in-camera—these are very straight photos."
